Reading Support	Service family students identified as requiring additional support	50% of a Teaching Assistant	Additional TA to support students who have not reached their chronological reading age.	8,000
Student managers	Service family students	50% of posts	The Academy employs additional student managers. This is partly in recognition of the additional administrative requirements connected with the mobility of service children, and additional pastoral support needed during challenging times.	13,000
CCF / Military /DofE Support	Service family students	60% of School Staff Instructor (CCF SSI) post	SSI responsible for CCF administration & governance (CCF 60%). Also supports DofE programme and wider military activities such as Remembrance and Community Week.	14,500

Summer school	Transition summer school for Y6	50% of staff costs	Students settle in to Year 7 far quicker than simply starting in September with the rest of their peers. Students understand expectations of secondary school, friendship groups in place and where to seek support when needed. This all reduces potential anxieties and leads to a positive start to time at the Academy.	3,000
Assisted travel (staffing & actuals)	Service family students		Coordinated by the Finance Director, a daily minibus is provided for service family students where reliable public transport is not available.	6,500
