BTEC Children's Play Learning and Development

What is the course like?

In BTEC Children's Play and Learning Development you will look at all the areas which impact on a child's development physically, cognitively, in language, emotionally and socially.

It will enable you to develop knowledge and understanding by applying your learning and skills in work-related contexts. The course also contains an element of work-experience in an Early Year's Setting which will allow you to put what you have learnt in the classroom into practise.

Course content

Theme 1: Child Development

Theme 2: Development of Children's Communication, Literacy and Numeracy skills.

Theme 3: Play and Learning

Theme 4: Children's Physical Development, Care and Health Needs

Entry requirement

5 GCSEs at 9-4 including English and Maths

Duration

2 years.

How will I be assessed?

You will have two externally assessments within your first year. One in a 1.5 hour examination, one controlled assessment and two pieces of coursework. There will also be 50 hours of work experience in an Early Years Setting to be undertaken over the two years.

Where does it lead?

This course is a versatile subject that can lead you on to a number of careers as well as gain entry to university. University courses where this could lead you are; Education, Childcare, Social Care, Child Psychology, Nursing or Midwifery to name a few. You may also find yourself fully employed in childcare following your course ending or gaining an apprenticeship in childcare.

Is this course suitable for me?

Yes, if you are proactive and want to work with children or within the healthcare sector. Students suitable for this course must be able to have good communication skills, show initiative and work as a team in both class and at their work experience placement.

Additional Information

- Students will be set up with an Early Years Setting which they will visit weekly.
 - Students will be expected to plan and carry out activities in their Early Years Setting.
- It is a very hands-on course – you can put the theories you have learnt in the classroom into practise.

How to Apply

- Complete and return an application form. Application forms are available from the Wellington Academy website: www.thewellingtonacademy.org.uk.
- Your completed application should be returned to Dave Bissington, Head of 6th Form, this can be done either via your tutor (if internal) or delivered to the school reception.
- Alternatively please complete an online form, found under 2021 – Applications on the 6th Form tab.
- You will have an individual course consultation, during which provisional courses will be agreed.
- The offer of the course will be conditional upon you meeting the required entry grades, any subject specific criteria and having a suitable reference from your previous school.
- Your final interview will be held immediately after you have received your GCSE results. This is when your actual offer is negotiated and confirmed.
